Some Caveats

- ⇒ The following is an analysis of bibliographic library data, NOT an analysis of newspaper history
- Library data is known to be:
 - → Subject to constant change
 - → Incomplete
 - → Of limited expressiveness
 - → Faulty
 - → Yet: the best available data source!
- What exactly is
 - → A newspaper ?
 - → A newspaper title?
 - → A newspaper's life-span?







ZDB data - newspapers


- Data basis: > 4,000 libraries in Germany and Austria
- Bibliographic metadata only, describing serial publications
- Quantities:
 - → 1.8 milion title records
 - → 13.5 million records describing holdings
 - → > 60,000 newspapers
 - → Data selection:
 - material type = newspaper
 - year of first publication = 1500-1944
 - form of publication = print
 - place of publication = Germany AND German Empire
 OR
 - language of publication = German
 - → Ca. 22,000 historic newspaper titles


















First years and frequency of publication









Life-spans


time period	mean	median	standard deviation	minimum	maximum

Newspaper titles per place of publication










Newspaper titles per place of publication










Libraries with relevant holdings










Maximum number of newspaper titles per library
























Conclusions

- Cooperation is a necessity because
 - → Only few newspaper titles with long life-spans are fully available in one library
 - → > 7,000 titles are only available in one library only
- Consider future use cases before digitising
- Use realistic criteria when deciding on
 - → Source for digitisation: paper original and microfilm
 - → Technical parameters: resolution, colour, storage formats
- Monitor progress comprehensively
- Enable access
 - → Provide open licenses
 - → Optimise acces to data
 - → Aggregate content
